Embed Young Liberals in regional parties

Recently EYL's stature in the English Party has gone from strength to strength. On English Council and ECE, I will use my consensus-building attitude to maintain and develop the bridges we have established over the past few years with other key stakeholders. However, there are huge inconsistencies in how regional parties engage with YL, with some regions virtually ignoring us. We can change this if we get more young people to attend regional conferences, to secure places on regional executives as well as maximising our presence on English Council. I will encourage this by:

- Surveying young members about their experiences of regional conferences as one of my first priorities
- Ensuring that YL conference access funds can be used to help young members get to regional conferences, and that this is well-advertised

Working with the YL Events Officer to encourage more regions to hold hybrid conferences

More confident and diverse regional chairs

EYL often struggles to recruit regional chairs. Elections are uncompetitive and shockingly lacking in diversity, with zero women coming forward last year. We need to understand why being a regional chair seems to be unappealing to so many. Furthermore, those who do become regional chairs may inherit a less-developed region, may not receive much of a handover from their predecessor, and may go on to stop engaging with EYL. I will encourage

more candidates to come forward in 2025, as well as support regional chairs over the coming year, by:

- Working with the Accessibility, Diversity and Standards Officer to address the lack of diversity in regional chairs
- Working with the Branch Development Officer to ensure that there is at least one active branch or society in each region which is engaged with YL at the regional level
- Producing simple welcome guides for new regional chairs so they can hit the ground running in January
- Supporting regional chairs throughout the year with monthly one-to-one meetings

Inviting successful former regional chairs to give talks to EYL Exec in order to preserve institutional memory and share best practices, and potentially explore the possibility of paired mentoring
